- 1. No Federal Fire Mitigation Act
- 2. No State Fire Mitigation Act

## TERMS TO BE ADDRESSED URGENTLY

- When the grass is green in the paddock you can safely burn in the bush.
- 2. Fires do not burn only between the hours 9am -5pm on chosen days.
- 3. Bush Fires control cannot be effective only between 9 5pm. Must be controlled 24 hrs a day.
- 4. Only accredited operators by recognition of prior learning of machinery for crucial fire edge direct attack.
- 5. Numerous DELWP personal not experienced.
- 6. Some Dept. experienced personal overlooked also local knowledge.
- Too many entities cause confusion DELWP CFA Greenies Shire Councils CMA Aboriginal Land & Water – City based environmental activists – Control from a distance etc.
- 8. Aerial fire-bombing / cart before the horse Water supplies almost non-existent in strategic areas, limiting effective use of helicopters.
- 9. Rehabilitation of ALL fire breaks should be only erosion control.
- All power line easements should be used as strategic safe areas / widen / burn from / manage & protect infrastructure.
- 11. New public buildings in high risk areas to be earth covered with strategic vegetation surrounds.
- 12. Recent fires of last 20 yrs. use Roadside and Waterways vegetated areas as wicks for bushfires. Numerous boundary fences were burnt that bordered roads and creeks.
- 13. Too much emphasis put on FALL-BACK lines instead of DIRECT-ATTACK of fires.
- 14. Lack of strategic fire break maintenance at safe time of the year Lack of on-going annual Pre Preparedness.
- 15. Inconsistent Planned Burns Thwarted and not followed up to form defensive lines of fire breaks.
- 16. Too Much Fire Lit in the prohibited period and is not properly contained to a designated area.
- 17. Private Property Boundaries should have a minimum of 20 mtr clearway with an additional 30 mtrs of intermittent vegetation.
